## **PLN 38B: Inquiry-Based Learning in the PLN Classroom (K-12)**

*4.5 Continuing Education Graduate Credits*

***Facilitator: Ross Cooper***

In this course participants learn about integrating inquiry-based learning in the classroom including an exploration of genius hour, personalized learning, and project based learning. The course focuses primarily on the six drivers of inquiry-based learning: keeping the end in mind, collaboration, questioning, overcoming constraints, productive struggle and feedback. Participants explore the integration of inquiry-based learning through PLN's Four Lenses of Learning and Five Reading, Writing and Talking Processes.

Participants experience and create inquiry-based units for hands-on classroom implementation that promote student choice and agency by putting students at the center of the learning. Participants need to purchase the two course texts before the course begins: *Hacking Project Based Learning: 10 Easy Steps to PBL and Inquiry in the Classroom* by Ross Cooper and Erin Murphy and *The Plainer Truths of Teaching, Learning and Literacy* by Morton Botel and Lara Paparo.
